Prophecies surrounding Jesus' birth and their fulfillment

Lighting of the Fourth Advent Candle: The Angel's Candle

So that Scripture would be fulfilled...

The Old Testament is filled with prophecies about the Savior. Many of these prophecies were fulfilled during the circumstances surrounding Jesus' birth. The fulfillment of each and every one of these prophecies is intended:

- to show that the author of the entire Bible is God: what he prophecies will happen and,
- to identify Jesus of Nazareth as the Savior who was foretold, and
- to show that God determined and set his heart to save us by sending own Son.

After rising from the dead, Jesus said to his disciples in Luke 24:44-45 "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled.' Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures."

On this morning of Christmas Eve, let us ponder the Old Testament prophecies which were fulfilled during the time surrounding Jesus' birth.

The very first Gospel promise... that a child born of a woman would crush Satan's head.

Prophecy

Pastor Bartels:

Genesis 3:15 [To the serpent God said,] I will put hostility between you and the woman, and between your seed and her seed. He will crush your head, and you will crush his heel.

Fulfillment: The seed of a woman:

Congregation:

Galatians 4:44 But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, 5 in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons.

Fulfillment: Destroy the power of the devil:

Pastor Van Kampen:

Hebrews 2:14 Therefore, since the children share flesh and blood, he also shared the same flesh and blood, so that through death he could destroy the one who had the power of death that is, the Devil

Prophecy - Descendant of Abraham

Pastor Bartels:

Genesis 12:1-3 Now the LORD said to Abram... 2 I will make you a great nation. I will bless you and make your name great. You will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse anyone who dishonors you. All of the families of the earth will be blessed in you."

Prophecy - Descendant of Isaac

Pastor Van Kampen:

Genesis 26:2-4 The LORD appeared to Isaac and said, "...I will be with you and will bless you... and I will establish the oath that I swore to Abraham your father. 4 I will multiply your descendants like the stars of the sky and will give all these lands to your descendants. In your seed all the nations of the earth will be blessed."

Prophecy - Descendant of Jacob

Congregation:

Numbers 24:17 I see him, but not now. I behold him, but not near. A star will come out of Jacob. A scepter will rise up out of Israel.

Prophecy - Descendant of Judah

Pastor Bartels:

Genesis 49:10 The scepter will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until the one to whom it belongs comes. He will receive the obedience of the peoples.

Prophecy - Descendant of Jesse

Pastor Van Kampen:

Isaiah 11:1-2 A shoot will spring up from the stump of Jesse, and a Branch from his roots will bear fruit. 2 The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him: the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.

Prophecy - Descendant of David

Congregation:

Isaiah 9:7 There will be no limit to his authority and no end to the peace he brings. He will rule on David's throne and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness from now on, into eternity. The zeal of the LORD of Armies will accomplish this.

Fulfillment

Pastor Bartels:

Matthew 1:1-16 (selected verses) A record of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. 2 Abraham was the father of Isaac. Isaac was the father of Jacob. Jacob was the father of Judah and his brothers... (skip 7 generations)... 5 Obed was the father of Jesse. 6 Jesse was the father of King David...(skip 24 generations)... 16 Jacob was the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, from whom Jesus was born (who is called Christ).

To be born in Bethlehem

Prophecy

Pastor Bartels:

Micah 5:2 But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, from you, will go out the one who will be the ruler for me in Israel. His goings forth are from the beginning, from the days of eternity

Fulfillment

Pastor Van Kampen:

Luke 2:1-5 In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governing Syria. 3 And everyone went to register, each to his own town. 4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the town of Nazareth, into Judea, to the town of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was from the house and family line of David. 5 He went to be registered with Mary, his wife, who was pledged to him in marriage and was expecting a child.

Prophecy

Pastor Bartels:

Isaiah 7:14 Therefore the Lord himself will give a sign for all of you. Behold! The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and name him Immanuel

Fulfillment

Congregation:

Matthew 1:18-23 18 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ took place. His mother, Mary, was pledged in marriage to Joseph. Before they came together, she was found to be with child by the Holy Spirit. 19 Joseph, her husband, was a righteous man and did not want to disgrace her. So he decided to divorce her privately. 20 But as he was considering these things, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." 22 All this happened to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 23 "Look, the virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son. And they will name him Immanuel," which means, "God with us."

Stay there until I tell you, because Herod will search for the child in order to kill him." 14 Joseph got up, took the child and his mother during the night, and left for Egypt. 15 He stayed there until the death of Herod. This happened to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I called my son."

Pastor Van Kampen:

Matthew 2:16-18 16 When Herod realized that he had been outwitted by the Wise Men, he was furious. He issued orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and in all the surrounding countryside, from two years old and under. This was in keeping with the exact time he had learned from the Wise Men. 17 Then what was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled: 18 A voice was heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and she refused to be comforted, because they are no more

Malachi 4:5-6 Look! I am going to send Elijah the prophet to you before the great and fearful day of the LORD comes! 6 He will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers. Otherwise, I will come and strike the land with complete destruction.

Fulfillment

Congregation:

Luke 1:11-17 11 An angel of the Lord appeared to [Zechariah], standing on the right side of the altar of incense. 12 When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and overcome by fear. 13 But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, because your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear a son for you, and you are to name him John. 14 You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth, 15 because he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to drink wine or beer. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb. 16 He will turn many of the sons of Israel back to the Lord their God. 17 He will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, to turn the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous, to prepare a people who are ready for the Lord."

Yes, she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. 3 A voice is calling out: In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD. In the wasteland make a level highway for our God. 4 Every valley will be raised up, and every mountain and hill will be made low. The rugged ground will become level, and the rough places will become a plain. 5 Then the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all flesh together will see it. Yes, the mouth of the LORD has spoken.

Pastor Van Kampen:

Matthew 3:1-3 In those days, John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the wilderness of Judea and saying, 2 "Repent, because the kingdom of heaven is near!" 3 Yes, this is he of whom this was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord. Make his paths straight."

Congregation:

Luke 2:10-14 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. For behold, I bring you good news of great joy, which will be for all people: 11 Today in the town of David, a Savior was born for you. He is Christ the Lord. 12 And this will be a sign for you: You will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." 13 Suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude from the heavenly army, praising God and saying, 14 "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward mankind."

Holy Cross is pleased to announce our new and improved online giving page! Vanco, our electronic giving provider, has updated their online giving platform to make it easier to make one-time gifts or set up recurring donations to our church. The new page is now live on our website. Nothing about our online giving has changed except for the visual look of the page. You can adjust existing donations, set up new gifts and update personal information much as you have before. How to sign up? It's easy! From there you can sign up to create a Vanco Online account and give to our various ministries. If you already have a Vanco account (if you have already set up a user-name and password on our online donation page), you can log in to the new page using the same username and password as before. Simply tap or click the "Log In" button at the top right of your screen. From there you can update scheduled donations or set up new recurring gifts by clicking "Profile" and then "View Scheduled Donations." ENDOWMENT FUND MATCHING OPPORTUNITY

A gracious donor has offered to match dollar for dollar any donations given to the Endowment Fund up to \$10,000. A gift to the Holy Cross Endowment Fund is a gift which 'keeps on giving." Once a gift is given to the fund, it builds interest or income. Only the interest is spent annually. The larger the fund grows, the greater the amount of interest that's available for the congregation to use for key non-budgeted items. This is an important fund for Holy Cross. For example, this year the Fund was used for the purchase and installation of 12 outdoor security cameras. Currently the Endowment Fund balance is approximately \$385,000. Praise God for this wonderful opportunity!

A lot of people believe in "Jesus," but once you start talking about the "Jesus" they believe in, you find that he is nothing like the Jesus you believe in. Phony Jesuses abound and seem almost hip-deep everywhere you look. Now comes the hard question – is the Jesus whom you believe in the one revealed in the Bible, or is he someone you find comforting but who you have patched together from ideas you have heard at various times in your life?
