

Old Testament Lesson

God sends his Spirit on his chosen Servant - a Messianic prophecy

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight. I am placing my Spirit on him. He will announce a just verdict for the nations. ²He will not cry out. He will not raise his voice. He will not make his voice heard in the street. ³A bent reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not snuff out. He will faithfully bring forth a just verdict. ⁴He will not burn out, and he will not be broken until he establishes justice on the earth. The coastlands will wait for his law. ⁵This is what the true God says, the Lord who creates the heavens and stretches them out, who spreads out the earth and everything that it produces, who gives breath to the people on it and life to those who walk on it. ⁶I am the Lord. I have called you in righteousness. I will hold on to your hand, and I will guard you. I will appoint you to be a covenant for the people, to be a light for the nations, ⁷to open the eyes of the blind, to bring the prisoners out from the dungeon, and to bring those who sit in darkness out of prison.

M: My heart is bubbling over with a beautiful theme.

- C: I am reciting my works for the King. You are the most beautiful of the sons of Adam.
- M: Grace is poured out on your lips.
- C: Strap your sword on your thigh, you mighty warrior, in your splendor and your majesty.
- M: In your majesty advance successfully. Ride forward in the cause of truth, humility, and righteousness.
- C: Let your right hand teach you awesome deeds.
- M: Your throne, O God, is forever and ever. The scepter of your kingdom is a scepter of justice.
- C: You love righteousness and hate wickedness.
- M: Therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of joy more than any of your companions.
- C: I will preserve the memory of your name through all generations. Therefore peoples will praise you forever and ever.

Historic Lesson.....Acts 10:34-38 God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit and with power.

³⁴Then Peter began to speak: "Now I really am beginning to understand that God does not show favoritism, ³⁵but in every nation, anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶He sent his word to the people of Israel, proclaiming the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. ³⁷"You know what happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached. ³⁸God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went around doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the Devil, because God was with him.

<u>Nicene Creed</u>

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. 




