Gospel Lesson Mark 11:1-10

Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD!

As they approached Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, on the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples 2 and told them, "Go into the village ahead of you. As soon as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. 3 If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it, and he will send it back here without delay."

4 They left and found a colt on the street, tied at a door; and they untied it. 5 Some who were standing there asked them, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" 6 The disciples answered them just as Jesus had instructed them, and the men let them go.

7 They brought the colt to Jesus, threw their garments on it, and Jesus sat on it. 8 Many people spread their garments on the road. Others spread branches that they had cut from the fields. 9 Those who went in front and those who followed were crying out,

Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!

10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!

To greet what pomp of kingly pride The soldiers mock, the rabble cries, the streets with tumult ring, no bells in triumph ring, no city gates swing open wide: as Pilate to the mob replies, "Behold, behold your King!" "Behold, behold your King!" 2 And yet he comes. The children cheer; 4 Now he who bore for mortals' sake with palms his path is strown. the cross and all its pains With ev'ry step the cross draws near: and chose a servant's form to take, The King of glory's throne. the King of glory reigns. Astride a colt he passes by Hosanna to the Savior's name as loud hosannas ring, till heaven's rafters ring, or else the very stones would cry and all the ransomed host proclaim "Behold, behold your King!" "Behold, behold your King!"

SUMMER ADVENTURES 2024

This summer we will welcome kids ages 5 - 12 years old for a fun, daily program! Days will be 6AM - 5:30PM between June 3 - August 15, 2024. Activities will include: picnics in the park, off-site field trips, water days, bike/scooter days, arts and crafts, story time, and more! The rate will be billed weekly and is as follows:

- Monday Friday (5 days): \$275/week
- 4 days: \$225/week

There is a 10% off multi-child discount for each additional full time child. Registration will open for Holy Cross and returning families on <u>February 5, 2024</u>. Registration will open for new families on <u>April 3, 2024</u>. There is a \$150 non-refundable registration fee. Other information to note: Children may be in our care for a maximum of 10 hours per day. Tuition will be charged on a weekly basis through an automatic withdrawal using our Brightwheel App. Tuition includes breakfast, lunch, and afternoon snack following USDA Food Guidelines. Rate builds in several days OFF: holidays and up to 5 vacation days for the child. Rate is charged weekly even if the child misses his/her scheduled days.
